the Administration on Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities, and the HHS Office on Disability to ensure a more comprehensive approach to aging and disability across the lifespan. ACL's mission is to maximize the independence and well-being of older adults, individuals with disabilities, and their families and caregivers. To support this mission, ACL funds a broad spectrum of services and supports delivered through state agencies and community-based programs, providing assistance on health and wellness, protecting rights, and finding research to improve our understanding of the health issues faced by an aging America (ACL, 2017a).

> The following brief serves as an introduction to the National Family Caregiver Support Program and related programs adjunistered by ACL that provide support to family caregivers of older adults. While this brief approaches these programs from the perspective of aging services and supports, they are not exclusive to caregivers of older Americans and reach a broad population.

An Overview of Informal Caregiving

As individuals age and begin to experience declines in their health, family members and fitends commonly assume greater roles in making treatment decisions and providing other supports to the care recipient. In many cases, these family and fitends take on the role of caregiver, performing tasks such as assisting with activities of daily living (ADLs) and instrumental
